Breast Augmentation – Post-Operative Instructions

Rest + Relaxation

- Preferably sleep on your back. It is okay to lie on your side. Do not lie on your chest.
- Wait 2 weeks before participating in physical activities that will increase your heart rate and blood pressure or cause your breasts to move significantly.

Washing

- Remove larger dressings 24 hours after surgery. Leave your steri-strips (white tape) in place for approximately 7-10 days. If they come off sooner that is okay.
- You can shower 48 hours after surgery unless you have drains in place. Wash gently with soap and water.
- Do not soak your surgical sites - no pools, hot tubs, lake or well water for 3-4 weeks.
- Dry surgical site by gently patting with a clean towel or allow to air dry.
- Bleeding (minimal) from your surgical site may occur following surgery. If it occurs hold constant firm pressure for 10-15 minutes with a clean towel. If bleeding persists or one side is becoming much larger than the other, see our emergency care instructions below.

Medication

- Anti-Pain medication can be taken after surgery.
- Resume prescribed medications unless otherwise stated.
- Take antibiotics as prescribed at the appropriate times until completed.
- Apply Polysporin (original ointment) to your incision line after the steri-strips are removed. Do this for 1-2 weeks.

Bra Wear

- Wear a non-underwired bra unless otherwise directed for 2 weeks. After 2-3 weeks switch to an underwire bra.

Three Weeks After Surgery

- Begin to massage your incisions with body lotion, BioOil, or equivalent scar cream (something non-irritating). Do not use 100% vitamin E (capsule or oil).
- If your incisions are going to be exposed to the sun, apply SPF 45 or higher for at least one year to prevent tanning.

Special Instructions

- Starting a few hours after surgery open your bra and apply cold compresses to your breasts for 10 minutes 3-4 times a day for 2 weeks to decrease swelling (a clean, lightly moist hand towel placed in freezer for 20-25 minutes, not an ice pack). *Check the colour of your nipple/areola. If purple please call the clinic or call me through after hour care phone line (604-527-4925).*
- Note, obtain a 24-hour prescription for antibiotics (usually Keflex) to take before and immediately after any future dental procedures. This should be obtained by your dentist (or GP).

Drain Care

- If drains have been placed, please follow the verbal instructions given to have them removed 24-48 hrs following surgery
- When drains are removed a small amount of yellow/pink/ blood tinged fluid may ooze out of drain site for up to 3 days.
- Place a small amount of Polysporin onto the drain site daily and cover with gauze or a Band-Aid.
- Drain sites will close in 3 to 7 days.
- Okay to shower chest 24 hours after drains removed.

Follow Up Care

- Dr. McInnes will let you know which location to visit him for your in-office follow up appointments. Please call the office to confirm the time (604-515-8847). Dr. McInnes may call you the evening of surgery to see how you're doing, please try to answer your phone (even if it's from "unknown caller").

After Surgery Care

- For general inquiries/questions email office@doctorm.ca or call the office.

Weekday Care (8 am to 5 pm)

- If there is a concern about your surgery or your healing please call the office.
